Project description

Executive summary [200 words maximum description.]

A review of the Nelson Tasman Regional Fuel Plan is required. Current resourcing levels preclude this work from being undertaken.

This proposed project will enhance both New Zealand's and Nelson Tasman's disaster risk resilience through application of best practice planning and coordination methodology.

Bulk fuel for the Nelson Tasman region is delivered to and stored at Port Nelson. All CDEM Groups require a regional fuel plan to sit under the national CDEM Fuel Plan.

The 2016 Nelson Tasman Lifelines Project identified the development of a regional fuel management plan during emergencies as a key piece of work to be progressed. The previous plan was carried out in 2009, recent planning around the AF8 project mean that now is an appropriate time to fully review and update the regions fuel plan.

A key public outcome from this Plan would be the development of key messaging around public and sector resilience and preparedness, and also strategic communications required during a response.

Challenge/opportunity [200 words maximum description.]

The Nelson Tasman Lifelines Group has recognised that all of the region's fuel arrives and is stored at the Port, which itself is vulnerable to earthquake and tsunami hazards. In addition, transport throughout the region is via some tenuous road links which are also vulnerable to a number of hazards.

This review of regional fuel interdependencies and updated riskscape will help inform future mitigation measures decision making and increase the region's resilience.

Strong relationships between the fuel sector and Nelson Tasman CDEM will be crucial once an emergency threatens to disrupt supply. There are mutual benefits for both sectors in such an event, however, there needs to be an agreed plan in place as a starting point to ensure both sectors interests are protected.

There are some large users of fuel which have been identified in the Nelson Tasman region to ensure lifelines remain operable and emergency services are able to continue their response.

The Fuel Plan will identify regionally critical fuel customers and have a transparent methodology for prioritising fuel deliveries to them.

Alignment with identified goals and objectives identified in the CDEM sector [200 words maximum description.]

The Nelson Tasman CDEM Plan goals are:

- Build strong, safe, resilient communities
- Reduce the risk of hazards
- Enhance response and recovery capability

This application aligns well with each of the goals in the Group Plan. It also aligns with the National CDEM Strategy Goal 3 'enhancing New Zealand's capability to manage civil defence emergencies' and specifically Goal 3B - 'enhancing the ability of CDEM Groups to prepare for and manage civil defence emergencies'.

Dissemination of benefits to sector [200 words maximum description.]

A Regional Fuel Plan will ensure that Nelson Tasman has arrangements in place as recommended in the National CDEM Fuel Plan.

The plan would be made available to all stakeholders who have input to this plan. The plan will also be sent to all other Groups for their information and possible use. The Nelson Tasman Lifelines Group look to implement sections in the plan that recommend further education and would assist businesses to develop business continuity plans. Recommendations in the plan would also inform the Nelson Tasman CDEM business planning process.

As a result of the plan, we would expect to see MOUs established between the fuel sector and Nelson Tasman CDEM which would each ones expectations of the other and the agreement on fuel distribution models given certain scenarios. This would give the Group confidence that there are fuel contingency arrangements in place if an emergency threatens supply to and around the region.

We would also look at developing key messages for the public around the use of fuel during a response. These messages would be developed with input from the key stakeholders. Whilst these messages would be used during an event, promoting them through the Readiness phase would also be beneficial.

As an international tourist destination, this project will help protect New Zealand's international reputation in regards to resilience and capacity to respond effectively to emergency events.
