Executive summary

This project has been developed to support better communication of Civil Defence messages to local Taranaki Maori communities, and to integrate Civil Defence Emergency Management messages into the work being undertaken by Kaupapa Maori providers.

Maori community are over represented in low decile communities, with on average lower incomes, higher rates of disease and disability, and therefore more vulnerable as a group. Good emergency risk communication principles targets vulnerable communities directly and engages communities of interest to develop resilience through community based activities.

This project has two parts

- 1) The development of material for staff working with Maori whanau to enable them to communicate the importance of whanau preparedness for emergencies. This would include working with a Maori provider to develop pamphlets, DVD, and other communication materials which are developed by Maori for Maori. The participation of Maori whanau ensures the relevance of material addressing emergency preparedness for this particular group.
- 2) Kaupapa Maori providers, who are working in the homes of vulnerable whanau developing resiliency in the boarder determinants of health and well being for whanau, will be trained in the delivery of the material to those vulnerable communities.

Problem/opportunity

Currently the Civil Defence community education and training material, which is developed to inform and increase community resilience through information, is generic and lacks a focus on specific communities of interest. The Taranaki Civil Defence Group through the Welfare Advisory Group has begun to target communities of interest starting with the most vulnerable, including the aged, the infirm, and the disabled through partnerships with the NGO sector and the Taranaki District Health Board.

To date there is no concerted targeting of Maori communities to support them to become more aware of the civil defence messages and become more prepared for an emergency. This community is known to experience a higher level of vulnerability, which is associated with low levels of emergency preparedness and awareness of public education material. This is an opportunity to work with these communities and develop projects which engage them in the design through to the implementation.

This project will create an opportunity to provide Kaupapa Maori providers with training material for staff, and communication material for Maori whanau which is educational, effective, and suitable for the target audience.
