Project description

Executive summary

Section 17 of the Civil Defence and Emergency Management Act 2002 requires CDEM groups to promote and raise public awareness in the groups region.

The Ministry of Civil Defence Emergency & Management Capability Assessment of July 2010 considered Marlborough's CDEM to be underperforming with respect to public education and awareness.

Subsequently Marlborough's CDEM Group Plan 2010-15 has identified the development of a comprehensive public education strategy as one of the main objectives for the next five years. The development of a range of creative and attractive public display and information materials will be key contribution to the strategy.

To enhance public awareness the group would like to target the larger communities such as Blenheim, Picton, Renwick and Havelock.

The CDEM group staff and volunteers regularly attend A&P shows and all manner of public displays. The group holds minimal display material and would like to purchase appropriate professional display material. Including an earthquake simulation room.

We would like to build a scaled down room on rollers similar to the one at Te Papa museum in Wellington to demonstrate to the public what it feels like to be in a building during an earthquake. The building would be portable and would be demonstrated at public festivals/shows, schools, gatherings and at A & P shows etc. This type of display would help raise awareness and attract the public to take a look at other readiness information material.

Last year Marlborough received a funding grant of \$30,000 from the MCDEM resilience fund to target small communities in Marlborough to develop community response plans. This project is still ongoing.

Problem/opportunity

Marlborough could become isolated very quickly from our neighbouring CDEM groups in a major event and our community needs to be aware they could be on there own for some time.

Our larger communities Picton, Blenheim & Havelock can, and have, been isolated from one another during storm events caused by flooding and slip. A major earthquake on the Alpine Fault remains the greatest threat to the region

Public awareness is essential to ensure all our communities can cope on their own. Evidence suggests that the public are not as prepared for a major emergency event as they need to be and significant work is required to raise the general level of public readiness.

Additionally many seasonal workers who come to Marlborough each year to work in vineyards, many cannot speak English. The strategy recognises the need to produce

information in a variety of languages.

The main opportunity is public participation and a community that is prepared to look after themselves during a prolonged event.

Alignment with identified goals and objectives

The group has a requirement under Section 17 of the Act to promote and raise public awareness on civil defence preparedness.

The Ministry of Civil Defence Emergency & Management Capability Assessment of July 2010 recommended for Goal 1 - "To increase community awareness, understanding, preparedness and participation in civil defence and emergency management." Marlborough's key performance indicators for Public Education Programme and Readiness and Response Promotion were rated by the Ministry at 40% and 20% respectively. Obviously this is one aspect which Marlborough needs to improve on.

The Capability Assessment recommended the group should develop "a comprehensive public education strategy." This recommendation has been incorporated as a key objective in the Marlborough CDEM Group Plan.

The Marlborough CEG discussed future work programmes at its meeting on Wednesday 30th March 2011. A number of options were considered, one option was further public education in the larger communities. The final decision by the CEG chair and the Emergency Management Staff was that public education/awareness is the most critical issue to be addressed in the region.

Staff from the Emergency Management office will undertake most of the planning, preparation and procurement. Outside contracted services will provide construction and specialist materials/skills.

We have had offers of assistance from engineering staff at Safe Air to assist with the building of a scaled down earthquake simulation room which would be mounted on rollers to simulate an earthquake. The room will be portable and durable with an expected life-span of 10years

Dissemination of benefits to sector

Marlborough Emergency Management staff attend many festivals, A&P shows, are very active during Get Ready, Get Thru Week and are actively involved in the Clued-Up Kids initiative. The public education strategy being developed will incorporate these activities with the works of other emergency services to ensure cohesive and coordinated approach across the region. The strategy will also identify any gaps in the targeted communities and seek to address the shortfall.

We are aware that the up take on the Get Ready Get Thru programme can be improved and we need to keep pushing the message at our own local area. The use of interesting, innovative and exciting display material will be of great assistance in drawing attention to the readiness message.

We aim to have a community that is more resilient and better prepared to look after themselves and their neighbours following a major event. More public awareness will assist the Group to manage an event with the community prepared and able to fend for themselves over an extended period.
