Project description

Executive summary [200 words maximum description.]

Developing the capability of the Bay of Plenty Civil Defence Emergency Management Group (BOPCDEMG) to manage an emergency is heavily reliant on having a fully functional, integrated and effective emergency management information system. The BOPCDEMG does not currently have such a system in place, relying heavily on a paper based system.

EMIS is the system which will provide the BOPCDEMG with this enhanced capability due to its capacity to provide and receive detailed, real-time event related information, including standardised reporting, alerting and mapping functionality.

This application is for funding a 12 month fixed term position to project manage the implementation of EMIS across the BOPCDEMG, to ensure that all parties have the required training, knowledge and infrastructure to implement/sustain and utilise its Readiness and Response capability.

Problem/opportunity [200 words maximum description.]

There is no capacity within the Bay of Plenty Group Emergency Management Office to project manage the implementation of EMIS across the BOPCDEMG to deliver a fully functioning, relevant and effective emergency management information system.

The funding will assist the BOPCDEMG to meet its national obligations in respect of EMIS, pending an independent review being undertaken by Cornwall Strategic which is reviewing the resourcing issues throughout the BOPCDEMG.

This role will project manage all aspects of EMIS implementation, including forming, facilitating or leading teams as required to complete implementation tasks. To ensure that policy and direction on EMIS implementation, standards and sustainment are embedded within the BOPCDEMG, this will include the formation of 'Working' and 'Governance' Groups.

The implementation of EMIS is seen as a key output of the BOPCDEMG Work Programme.
