Executive summary [200 words maximum description.]

Since the Canterbury Earthquakes starting 4 September 2010 the Waimakariri District Council has gained significant experience in the field of Disaster Recovery.

The objective of this project is to document the key principles and processes they have identified as important in an integrated community recovery model.

The document will provide tools to identify the social, physical, environmental and economic impacts of the disaster and considerations on how to develop plans around each of the key areas.

The roles of various players will be documented as follows:

- 1. A Council approach to Recovery
- 2. The role of community in Recovery
- 3. The role of the NGO sector in Recovery
- 4. The role of the faith based community in Recovery
- 5. The role of volunteers in Recovery
- 6. The role of Residents Associations in Recovery
- 7. The role of Government Agencies in Recovery

A number of interviews will be held with key stakeholders, from each of the sections listed above across Waimakariri to document their roles and responsibilities in Recovery work.

The outcome will be that the sector will have a 'How to Guide' that will help them establish their Recovery work, should they need to. It will not provide detailed 'stories' of work undertaken in Waimakariri but will provide a framework of key principles and processes that players have found useful.

The bid seeks funding of \$40,000 in order to undertake a comprehensive interview/survey process for this project. An external writer(s) will be employed to complete this work by June 2013.

Problem/opportunity [200 words maximum description.]

The Canterbury Earthquakes provide the opportunity to document the lessons learnt so that in future events TLA's, tasked with leading Recovery will have a guide from which to start their work.

It will provide a 'framework' for action and make TLA's aware of the breadth of issues they

could be considering as well as an understanding of the community's role in Recovery and the role many agencies, organisations and groups can play to help a community recover.

Alignment with identified goals and objectives [200 words maximum description.]

This project would share information and knowledge to meet the following goals in the National CDEM Strategy:

- increasing community awareness, understanding, preparedness and participation in civil defence emergency management;
- enhancing New Zealand's capability to recover from civil defence emergencies.
