This proposal involves employing a business resilience contractor to provide workshops, 'how to' guides, support to partner agencies and an online toolkit to be utilised nationally after completion of the project.

The initiatives detailed in this application will contribute to the building of a 'Resilient Nelson Tasman Community, while also adding value to the wider CDEM sector nationally as well as to our neighbouring CDEM Groups. These applications align with the National CDEM Strategy goals, our Group Plan, are sustainable going forward and provide value for money. This application responds to the recommendation in our Capability Assessment report to provide business continuity support to the representative agencies across the Nelson Tasman Group in the spirit of the CDEM Act 2002.

Business Continuity Contractor:

The appointment of a Business Continuity Contractor, reporting to the Nelson Tasman Emergency Management.

Functions/taskings undertaken by the Business Continuity Contractor may consist of, though are not limited to, the following:

- □ Workshops to enable readiness for emergency response organisations, emergency services, local authorities, health service providers and NGO's including:
 - Planning, training and exercising; to be able to function to the fullest possible extent during and after an emergency
 - $\circ\quad$ Tools to enable organisations to respond and recover after events
 - Identify risks and their impacts, protecting business assets
 - o Protection of internal and external serviceability
 - Develop processes to manage disruption
- Develop resources and online tool kits for organisations to be able to use to develop their own Business Continuity Plans and long term strategies.
