Project description

Executive summary [200 words maximum]

The purpose of this proposal is to request funding to support the understanding of a 'Blue Zone' for Tsunami evacuation mapping and signage for the Manawatū-Whanganui Region to align with national standards and neighbouring CDEM Groups.

This will include the design, manufacture, and installation of Tsunami evacuation zone mapping and information boards for coastal communities (and visitors) who are disproportionately exposed to Tsunami risk, including localised signage in Te Reo for affected Marae. Current local authority funding does not allow for any redevelopment / redesign of Tsunami information signs to align with the new 'Blue Zone'.

This application also includes the design of new Tsunami Information Guides for the Region which will be disseminated to disproportionately affected communities and will aid in increasing public education of Tsunami risk of local communities and those visiting the area.

This clear, consistent identification of Tsunami risk will be incorporated into future community resilience plans which allows for greater community resilience and response to / recovery from emergencies.

Challenge/opportunity [200 words maximum]

The Manawatū-Whanganui Region is vulnerable to tsunami hazards on both the east and west coasts, with numerous communities exposed. While there is some existing tsunami evacuation zone signage and information available to the public, this is no longer consistent with the national standard of one 'Blue Zone'. There is very limited budget available for any redevelopment of maps, plans, signs, or information boards for both CDEM planning and public education available within the Region.

The creation of information boards incorporating maps showing the 'Blue Zones' will allow for consistent messaging with national standards and with neighbouring CDEM Groups. This will also allow for new mapping and messaging to be incorporated into any existing and future Community Resilience or Response Plans. The inclusion of Te Reo specific signs at key locations such as exposed Marae continue to build strong relationships with Iwi/Māori within the Region.

This project aligns with the allocation principle of **Tsunami Resilience.** Without funding support the region has limited resources to fund the upgrading of existing, outdated, tsunami evacuation zone signs for public safety. Local authorities do not have funding allocated for evacuation sign replacement to align with new guidelines within as set out in new Tsunami Evacuation Zone DGL (to be finalised).

This will also allow the Manawatū-Whanganui Region to align with both national guidance, and neighbouring CDEM groups for a consistent approach.

This project will use Operational expenditure (OPEX) to deliver its outcomes.

Application of outcomes/benefits to sector [200 words maximum]

The aim of this project is to enhance community resilience to Tsunami hazard and increase public awareness using information and signage that is consistent with both national guidance and neighbouring CDEM Groups.

This Tsunami hazard risk information and mapping will be incorporated into current and future Community Resilience / Response Plans to empower individuals, households, and communities to build their resilience to and recovery from tsunami risk.

This project will be publicised using current community engagement and public education programmes, increasing public awareness of tsunami hazard risk.

Ongoing costs (post-project) and how it will be funded [200 words maximum]

Ongoing maintenance of signs / infrastructure, and community engagement / preparedness will be covered by local authorities as with existing emergency management activities. Signage will be created and installed as Operational Expenditure (i.e. will not depreciate over time), and will replaced when and where necessary.
