Immigration New Zealand

- 96 per cent of Recovery Visas have been decided. On average, INZ processes Recovery Visa applications in six weekdays, with approved applications taking an average of five weekdays. Since the previous weeks report a further 31 applicants have arrived into New Zealand, and an additional 29 applications received.
- RSE workers continue to move between the impacted regions and others throughout the country. This represents seasonal trends and is now unlikely a significant consequence the extreme weather events.

New Zealand Claims Resolution Service (NZCRS)

• As concerns with the full and final insurance settlements are highlighted, NZCRS are working with individual insurers and the Insurance Council of New Zealand to resolve these quickly.



Temporary Accommodation Service

- The part-payment waivers and deferrals policy is currently being operationalised and implemented. Households staying in TAS accommodation are required to pay a part payment towards the cost of this temporary accommodations; the remaining cost of the accommodation is covered by TAS.
- The cost for temporary accommodation is set based on the lowest quartile of market rent for the affected region, minus 10%.

Labour Market

• In Tairāwhiti, the Civil Construction sector is supporting the transition of forestry contractors to civil work. This is due to the identified advantage of the forestry and civil sectors' compliance regulations aligning well, creating an efficient redeployment from forestry to civil sectors, particularly roading.
