Immigration New Zealand

- 94% of Recovery Visas have been decided. On average, INZ processes Recovery Visa applications in six weekdays, with approved applications taking an average of five weekdays. Since the previous weeks report a further 24 applicants have arrived into New Zealand, and an additional 32 applications received.

Temporary Accommodation Service

- To date, TAS has deployed 21 relocatable accommodation units to impacted regions, with 12 in Wairoa, 5 in Pōrangahau, 3 in Waiohiki and 1 in Waipawa. Another 4 are to be deployed over the next two weeks.

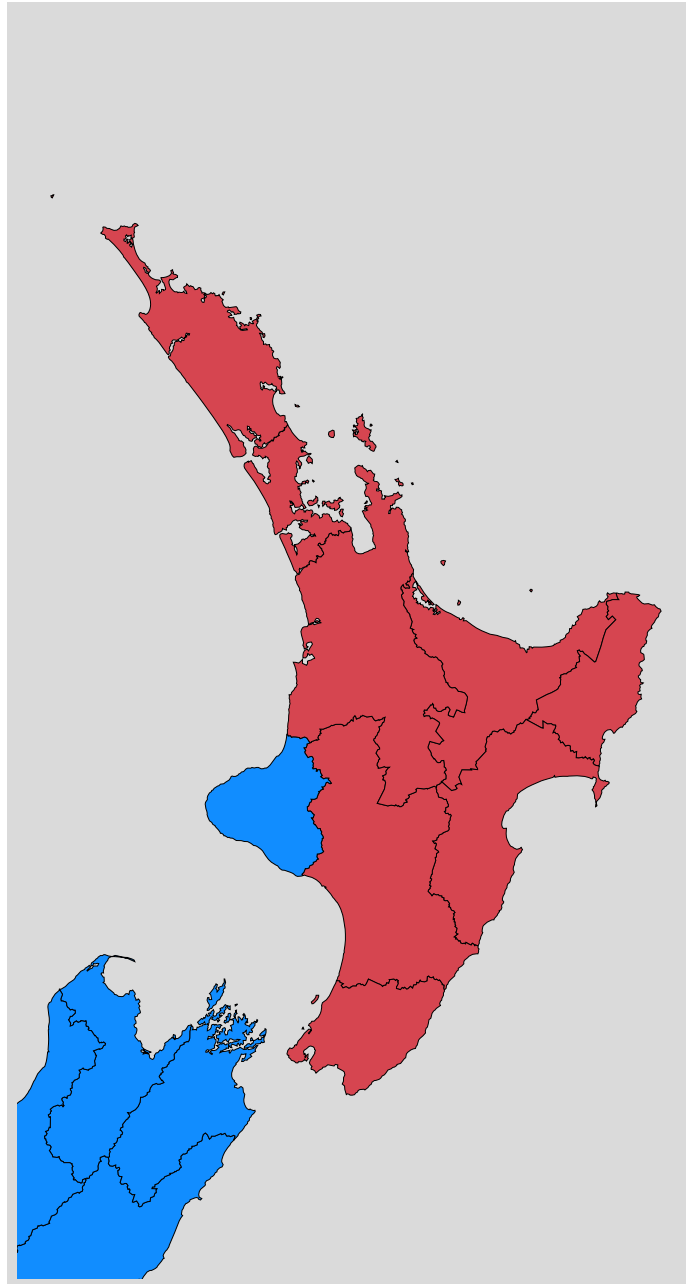

Labour Market

- Business employment data shows job numbers for March 2023 quarter remaining relatively stable for all affected territorial authorities.
- Updated monthly filled job numbers show a similar trend, with most regions seeing an increase in the number of jobs over the month of April. Tairāwhiti, was the exception and saw no job growth over the month, however this follows a typical seasonal pattern for this region.
- This growth in job numbers indicate that government support has helped to smooth employment impacts, helping stabilise the affected regions' labour markets in the short term. This includes support packages made by various central and local government bodies as well as non-government relief such as iwi intervention and philanthropic assistance.
