Immigration New Zealand

- There have been 54 new Recovery Visa applications received since the last report, with an additional 52 applicants arriving in New Zealand. It is expected that this will significantly help recovery in the regions.

New Zealand Claims Resolution Service (NZCRS)

- In May, NZCRS provided on the ground support in Tairāwhiti, Nelson and Tāmaki Makaurau, along with the Temporary Accommodation Service (TAS). NZCRS helps homeowners find resolution by providing access to advice, case management where appropriate and legal, engineering and wellbeing support, tailored to their individual needs.

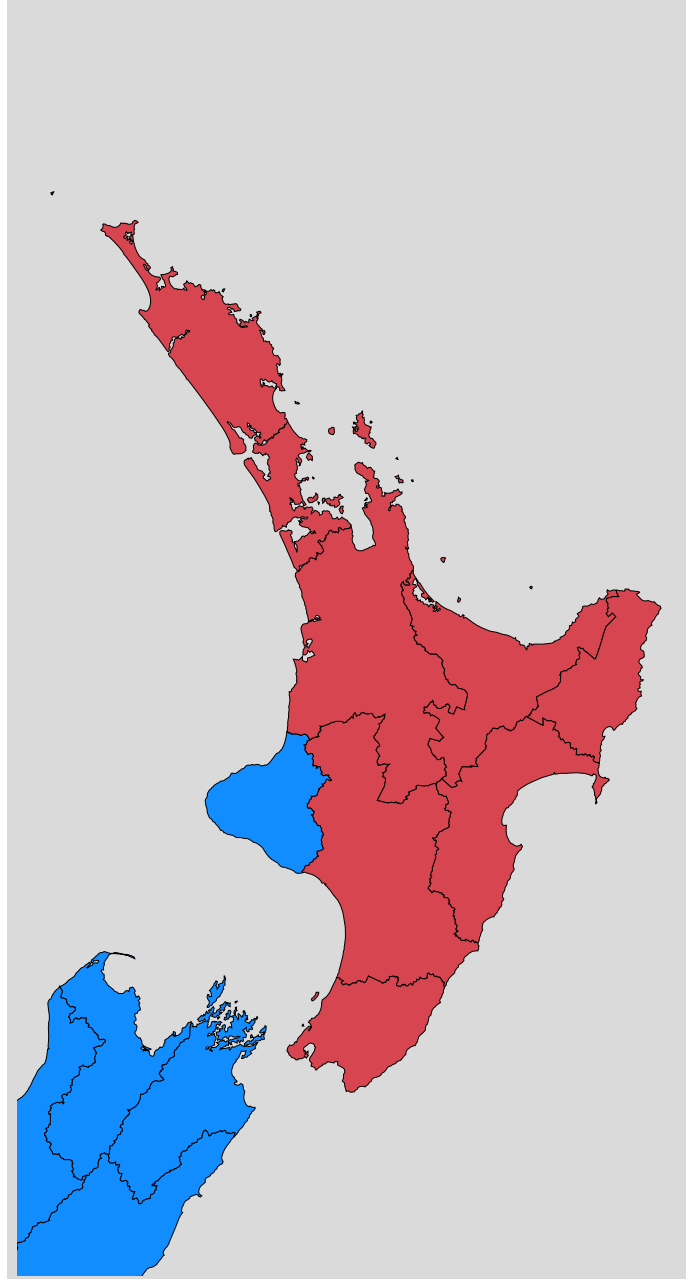

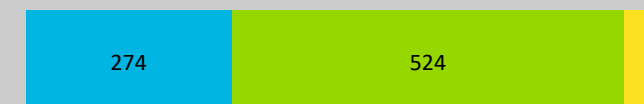
